Erie County reports 21 new positive cases of COVID-19 for total of 183

Erie, PA – County Executive Kathy Dahlkemper today announced 21 new positive cases of COVID-19 have been reported in Erie County. The total positive cases of COVID-19 in Erie County to date is 183, with 3,558 negatives and 121 recovered.

“Please help us,” said Dahlkemper. “Staying home is still the best way to stay safe, even though the stay-at-home order has been lifted. Maintain your space. Avoid gathering with more than 25 people. Remember that anyone can have the virus without feeling sick. Cover your face. Wear a mask when visiting with friends, even when you are outside, and maintain a 6-foot distance. Wash your hands often, and for at least 20 seconds each time. If the virus can’t stick, it can’t make you sick. We need you to do your part.”
