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HIV/AIDS Awareness Walk to be held on May 21

Erie, PA — The Erie County HIV Task Force and Erie County Department of Health will host its annual **Erie County HIV/AIDS Awareness Walk** on May 21, Saturday starting at 12 noon. Now on its fifth year, the walk's aim is to call attention to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), the virus that causes acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS), a condition that interferes with the body's ability to fight infections.

The walk will begin in front of Adagio Health Erie, 3530 Peach St., Erie. "We invite everyone to join us for the approximately 1.5-mile walk. Everyone has power over their health. We can all help prevent the spread of HIV," said Gary Snyder, HIV disease intervention specialist at Erie County Department of Health. It is free to participate.

Health education about HIV and free HIV and sexually transmitted infection (STI) testing will be provided by Adagio Health on-site. Other supporters and participants of this year's walk include Central Outreach Wellness Center of Erie, Community Health Net, Erie Gay News, Nicotine Free Northwest Pennsylvania, Northwest Pennsylvania Pride Alliance, PA Thrive Partnership and SafeNet.

In 2019, an estimated 1,189,700 people in the United States 13 years and older had HIV; approximately 13% of whose infections had not been diagnosed. In 2021, there was an increase of 17,817 cases. An estimated 1 in 8 people are living with HIV, unaware that they have this disease.

"We strongly encourage everyone in the community who is sexually active or shares needles for intravenous (IV) drugs to get tested for HIV," said Snyder. "Talk to your healthcare provider on ways to reduce your risk to HIV and about annual HIV testing as part of your medical care. Testing results can help determine appropriate care and treatment if needed."
